#### **IUNIOR YEAR TIMELINE**

#### FALL CHECKLIST

- Make a list of abilities, personal qualities, and what you may want to study/do in college
- Learn about colleges. Look at their websites. Check SuperMatch found under the "Colleges" tab in Naviance or the Collegeboard version, <u>BigFuture</u>.
- Use Naviance to list 15 colleges of interest.
- Research colleges on your list (minimum GPA requirements, course credits, standardized test scores, competitive GPA), through your Naviance account.
- Inform guidance counselor if you plan to play an NCAA sport.
- If planning to play a sport in college, register with the <u>NCAA Eligibility Center</u>
- If appropriate, gather material for your portfolio (e.g. for drama, music, art, sports, etc.).
- Review "Career Interest Inventory" and "Strengths Explorer" (Naviance) with your guidance counselor.
- Talk to friends, family, teachers, and recent MVC grads about their college experiences.

#### WINTER CHECKLIST

- Sign up for Spring SAT/ACT. To prepare, download practice booklets from <a href="www.collegeboard.org">www.collegeboard.org</a> and other great test prep resources like <a href="Khan Academy">Khan Academy</a>.
- Think about taking <u>SAT Subject Tests</u> in the spring, while course material is still fresh in your mind; but know many colleges do not consider these results.
- If you're in Advanced Placement (AP) classes, register for May AP Exams.
- Login to <u>My College Quickstart</u> data and use your PSAT data to create a SAT study plan, search colleges, and career exploration.

#### SPRING CHECKLIST

- Visit colleges (large, small, public, private). Get a feel for what works for you. Attend college fairs, too. Take advantage of virtual tours, if available.
- Develop a list of 15-20 colleges that attract you.
   Request view books and info on financial aid and programs of interest. Visit colleges over Easter.
- Meet with guidance counselor about your list.
   Determine "Reach," "Fit," and "Safety" schools.
- Plan a summer internship, career exploration, service, and/or other resume building opportunities.

#### SUMMER CHECKLIST

- Find a full-time or part-time job, or participate in a camp or summer college program.
- Visit colleges. Make appointments for interviews with admissions counselors (when available).
- Complete the Senior Survey a record of your accomplishments, activities, and work experiences since you started high school.

#### **SENIOR YEAR TIMELINE**

#### AUGUST

- Have a list of the colleges where you will apply.
- Be signed up for/or have taken SAT, ACT, TOEFL
- Have rough drafts of your personal statement.
- Have a list of all community service hours, awards, and recognitions.
- Check transcripts for accuracy

#### **SEPTEMBER**

- Register early for fall SAT/ACT
- Start applications right away if applying through Early Action/Early Decision (deadlines in Nov.)
- Start essays & update your resume

#### OCTOBER

- Request letters of recommendation
- CSU filing period Nov. 1 Nov. 30
- FAFSA opens Oct. 1

### NOVEMBER

- Submit Early Action/Early Decision app on time
- UC filing period Nov. 1 Nov. 30 (opens Aug. 1)
- Complete essays and get help with proofreading
- Follow up with teachers re: letters of rec.

#### DECEMBER

- Last recommended test dates
- Try to wrap up college applications
- Early Action/Early Decision responses arrive

#### JANUARY

- Early Action/ Early Decision responses arrive
- Mid-year reports are due

#### MARCH

• March 2: deadline for FAFSA and Cal Grant

#### APRIL

Most admission decisions & financial aid award letters arrive

#### MAY

- May 1<sup>st</sup> is decision day for most colleges
- AP exams are administered
- Submit your Exit Survey

#### JUNE

 Make sure your counselor knows where to send your final transcript!

### IMPORTANT links to check out on NAVIANCE

- ✓ SUPERMATCH (find a good fit) -- after login -- COLLEGES > FIND YOUR FIT > SUPERMATCH
- $\checkmark$  MY ASSESSMENTS your strengths, interests, careers paths -- ABOUT ME > MY ASSESSMENTS > take all 3
- ✓ FAMILY CONNECTION (the main page after login) -- key links for transcripts, letters of rec, etc.
- ✓ ABOUT ME > MY STUFF > RESUME -- track your community service, activities, awards, etc.



# WHAT ARE SCHOOLS LOOKING FOR?



### YOU INCREASE YOUR CHANCES BY:

#### ✓ ACHIEVING YOUR HIGHEST POTENTIAL AS AN MVC STUDENT

- Stick with your courses, and if struggling, get help through Flex and/or tutoring
- o If still struggling, visit your guidance counselor
- Grades matter. Get a "C" or better in core classes for UC/CSU
- Choose classes related to your intended major and interests
- Take increasingly challenging courses, even through your senior year

#### ✓ ACHIEVING YOUR HIGHEST POTENTIAL IN OTHER AREAS GOD HAS GIFTED YOU:

- Colleges love seeing unusual leadership, service, initiative, and ingenuity in applicants
- Develop and demonstrate your highest potential as an athlete, artist, etc.
- Be involved in clubs, teams, community service (including summer opportunities)

#### ✓ TAKING AND RETAKING ADMISSIONS ASSESSMENTS (SAT, ACT, etc.)

• The first time you take one, learn from your mistakes, study strategically, and retake

#### ✓ APPLYING TO SCHOOLS THAT MATCH YOUR ACADEMIC CREDENTIALS

• Having "reach schools" is great, but your best chances come from finding a match

Strength of Curriculum	51.8	35.3
Admission Test Scores (SAT, ACT)	54.3	27.9
Essay or Writing Sample	18.9	35.9



# **GENERAL APPLICATION ADVICE**













#### COMMUNICATION & RESPONSIBILITY

#### ✓ CHECK TRANSCRIPTS

- Make sure they are accurate for your team sports, repeated courses, test scores, etc.
- If something is missing or wrong, note it on your transcript and talk to your counselor ASAP

#### ✓ REOUEST TRANSCRIPTS

- Submit all transcript/counselor form requests through FAMILY CONNECTION
- Your counselor will submit your transcript on your behalf

#### ✓ COMPLETE YOUR SENIOR SURVEY

• It is used when counselors and teachers write your recommendations/evaluations (without it, you are at a disadvantage)

### ✓ REVIEW

 Review requirements before completing applications, and review your application to ensure completion before submitting

#### ✓ USE YOUR LEGAL NAME & PERSONAL EMAIL ADDRESS

 Do not use your MVCS student email address for your college applications; this will no longer be active once you graduate

#### ✓ BE ORGANIZED

Keep track of your dates, deadlines, supplemental requirements, etc.

#### ✓ PAY CLOSE ATTENTION TO DEADLINES & CHECK EMAIL FREQUENTLY

• After completing your applications you will receive access to individual school portals

#### ✓ GET GREAT RECOMMENDATIONS

- Ask teachers who know and love you -- give them at least a 2-week turnaround
- Make all requests for letters of rec through FAMILY CONNECTION



# **UC & CSU APPLICATION INFO**







#### UC

- Designed for top 9% of students in CA
- Government funded research institutions
- Sometimes more cost effective than private colleges
- 9 campuses

#### CSU

- Designed for top 33% of students in CA
- Typically more cost effective than UC
- 23 campuses

### **UC APPLICATION:**

- ✓ To apply to UC (opens on Aug. 1, 2018)
- ✓ UC Filing Period: Nov. 1 30, 2018
- ✓ UC Application Hotline: (800) 207-1710
- ✓ Take Admissions Tests (ACT/SAT/TOEFL) by Dec. 2018

### **CSU APPLICATION:**

- ✓ To apply to CSU (opens on Oct. 1, 2018)
- ✓ Filing Period: Nov. 1 Nov. 30, 2018
- ✓ Take Admissions Tests (ACT/SAT/TOEFL) by Dec. 2018

# REQUIREMENTS (A to G)

## UC & CSU SCHOOLS HAVE MINIMUM HS GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

a: history/ social science 2 years

**b: English** 4 years

c: mathematics

3 years (4 years preferred) d: lab science 2 years (3 years preferred)

e: world language

2 years (3 years preferred) f: visual & performing arts

g: college-prep elective

## **CA Community Colleges**

- ✓ To Apply to a CA Community College
- ✓ Cost Effective (about \$46.00 per unit)
- ✓ Often Great For General Ed When You're Less Sure About What You Want to Do
- ✓ Can Be An Effective Route to UC & CSU -- (especially through honors pathways)
- ✓ Check out <u>Running Start program</u> at Cabrillo College (Intent to participate is by January 2019). <u>Mallory Robinette</u> is our MVC contact
- ✓ Any California high school graduate is able to attend

#### **Private**

- ✓ <u>To Apply, The Common App</u> is used by many private colleges. Others use their own application system
- ✓ Often more expensive than public schools -- but some have excellent scholarship opportunities
- ✓ Wide variety of sizes, selectivity, cost, and religious affiliations

\*\*\*\*

#### Out of State

- ✓ Naviance Helps You Broaden Your Search Beyond CA
- ✓ Many MVC students go beyond CA as they search for opportunities around Degree Programs, Acceptance Rates, and Scholarships
- ✓ <u>The WUE (Western Undergraduate Exchange)</u> makes out of state tuition more affordable for certain schools

- ✓ Application for financial aid opens October 1 www.fafsa.ed.gov
- ✓ Blue & Gold Opportunity Plan (to make UC more affordable for lower-income families)

#### CAL GRANT

- ✓ Form of "Gift Aid" that is based on GPA and financial need
- ✓ Deadline to submit GPA Verification form is March 2, 2018

- ✓ Fastweb www.fastweb.com
- ✓ Monte Vista Memorial Scholarships

- ✓ Many universities have school-specific scholarships
